## Instructions for Learning with Lee cd's

These cd's are designed to run with your Windows-based web browser. As soon as you insert the cd, the Windows cd autoload program should bring you to a menu from which you can start the cd.<sup>1</sup>

In order for the sound to function, you need to have sound turned on in your browser, and a program that reads "wav" files. Windows comes with one installed. You may need to adjust the sound on your system – the method of doing this varies with the sound program.

Here is a typical view of a screen:

The book icon in the upper right indicates that this view has a sound file associated with it.

In some of the later cd's, I switched to using mp3 files. In many computers, the automatic program for mp3 files is Apple's QuickTime. If your file types are set so that Quicktime runs mp3's, then most likely, the visual will disappear and be replaced by the Quicktime console. In order to hear the sound files and see the slide simultaneously, you will need to do one of two things:



1) Whenever you see the "Click for audio" option, right click on the link and select "Open in New Window." The audio will open in a separate window and you can then click on the slide and have the audio playing in the background; OR:

2) Change the settings so that Windows Media Player is the default for MP3. Windows Media Player will generally open as a separate window, and then you can still see the slide. To change the setting, open Windows Media Player. Just below the "Now Playing" option you will see a small drop down on the far left. Click that drop-down, select the option "Plug-ins" and choose "Options." Now click on the tab for "File Types" and make sure that there is a check mark next to "MP3 audio file (mp3)." Click OK or Apply and now this will be your default MP3 player.

Also please note that you can navigate between frames using either the frame list on the left, or the navigation buttons toward the upper right.

<sup>1</sup> If you have turned off the autoload program, then you will need to load the file "begin.htm" from either the main directory of the cd, or from the one subdirectory present. Alternately, if you go into Windows Explorer and click on the cd icon, it will give you an option to perform the autoload feature.
